

## Fact sheet: Clovis Community Medical Center

### Background

Clovis Community Medical Center has grown in scope and reputation since its establishment in 1965 as the 35-bed, acute-care Clovis Memorial Hospital at DeWitt and Sierra avenues in Clovis, Calif.

In 1979 the hospital merged with the then-Fresno Community Hospital and in 1982 Clovis Memorial Hospital's name changed to Clovis Community Hospital. Clovis residents, merchants, guild members and others continued with fundraising efforts and individual contributions for future expansion and equipment needs.

In 1988, Clovis Community Hospital opened at its current location on the northeast corner of Herndon and Temperance avenues. Tucked in a lush orange grove just below the Sierra Nevada Mountains, the acclaimed medical center provides comfort, care and healing in a serene environment. Now known as Clovis Community Medical Center, the hospital is often Valley residents' first choice for women's services, advanced surgeries and comprehensive care.

The Clovis Outpatient Care Center was built in 2002 and is one of the busiest outpatient surgery centers in the area, performing more than 680 surgeries a month in its 10 operating rooms. A new dedicated endoscopy suite was completed in the 2009 expansion which included a six-bay pre-operative area, nurses station, four new procedure rooms, private family conference area and private exit with reserved patient pick up area.

Breast care services also were expanded to allow the Marjorie E. Radin Breast Care Center to continue meeting the unique needs of women while setting a new standard of care for breast health. Here, advanced technology and medical leaders in breast care have come together in a welcoming, comfortable environment. The Radin Breast Care Center is designated as a Center of Excellence by both the American College of Radiology and the National Quality Measures for Breast Centers.

### Clovis Community expansion

Clovis Community's service area is projected to grow by 15,000 people in the next five years and see a 43% increase in overall growth in the next 20 years. To meet this growth, Clovis Community embarked on a massive \$300 million expansion and renovation project.

With its Outpatient Care Center renovation complete, construction is now focused on the hospital's inpatient expansion.

Scheduled for completion in late 2013, this expansion and renovation will nearly double the hospital's capacity to 205 private rooms – making Clovis Community the only full-service hospital in the area with all private rooms. In addition, the Clovis expansion could be the single biggest job-creation project in Fresno County over the next few years, creating approximately 4,000 construction jobs.
